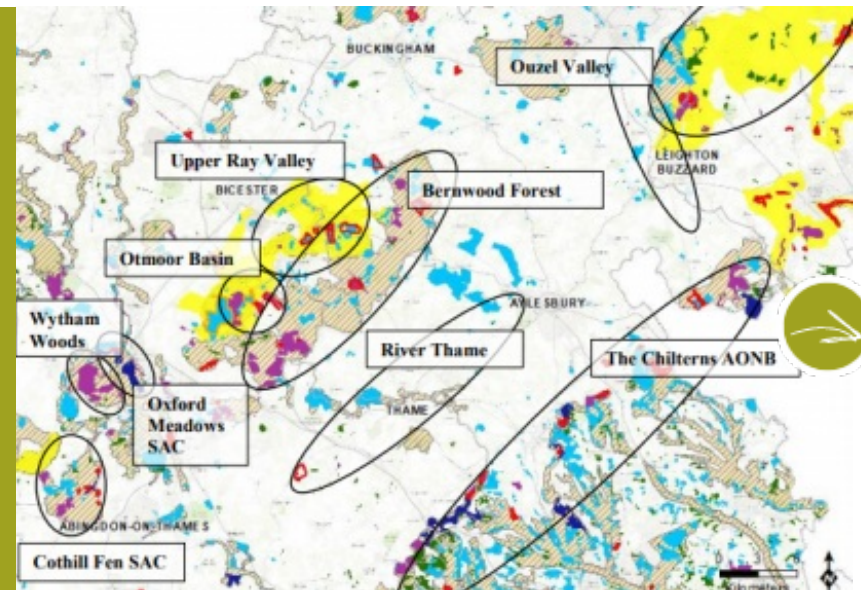

Act for Nature

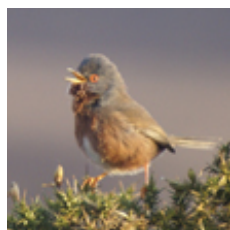

The Government's proposal for High Speed Two railway between London and Birmingham and beyond to the north of England, is currently one of our major campaigns.

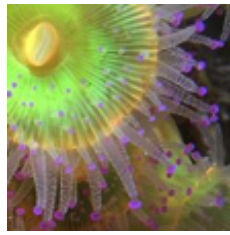

EU Habitats and Birds Directives

We are very concerned about the Government's proposed changes to the Habitats and Birds Directives, EU legislation that has helped to protect special areas such as the Thames Basin Heaths for wildlife.
