We are the leading wildlife conservation charity in Gwent working for the wildlife and people of this rich and varied landscape.

Gwent Wildlife Trust is part of the influential UK-wide partnership of 47 Wildlife Trusts. The Trust has worked for 50 years to protect wildlife, wildlife rich places, and educate, influence and empower people. We manage over 25 of the best areas for wildlife and help others to manage theirs. Through the generosity of our members our work is helping to secure the future of many important habitats and species, which might otherwise be lost.

In only the last few years, the Trust has:

- Re-introduced water voles, the UK's most threatened mammal back onto the Gwent Levels where they haven't been seen for over 10 years
- Purchased nearly 30 acres of Barecroft Common some of the last remnants of grazing marsh lying adjacent to Magor Marsh Nature Reserve
- Established our own flock of rare breed sheep for conservation grazing of some of our nature reserves
- Enabled over 200 volunteers to take positive action for their local environment
- Advised landowners on how to manage their land for wildlife and allocated grants to owners of Local Wildlife Sites to help them manage their land for wildlife
