Where's Your Wildlife will help people discover, explore and care for wildlife on post-industrial sites like this.



Where's Your Wildlife offers a programme of activities, workshops and events aimed at helping local communities discover, explore and care for wildlife on post-industrial sites like The British in Torfaen.

Gwent Wildlife Trust has been successful in securing funding support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Morrisons to help people in Torfaen and Blaenau Gwent get closer to the wildlife on their doorstep. Made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, the project will benefit from funding of just over £62 000 to support a two year project focused on The British in north Pontypool, [Silent Valley Nature reserve](#) near Cwm and Central Valley, a site on the former Ebbw Vale steelworks.

The project will offer a programme of activities, workshops and events aimed at helping local communities discover, explore and care for wildlife on post-industrial sites like The British. The sites have become rich in wildlife and we need to value and protect them - often they are thought of as barren and dangerous.

Living Valleys Manager, Veronika Brannovic, said: *'We want to change that and enthuse local communities about the nature that is right on their doorstep. This project will seek to change perceptions of sites like this from being 'blights on the landscape' to natural treasure troves. It's really exciting that National Lottery Heritage Fund and Morrisons have provided this support for the project.'*
