- Make Space for Nature Wildlife Gardening By making simple changes you can make a huge difference to wildlife in your area.
- Make Space for Nature No Garden? No Problem! If you don't have a large garden or, in fact, any garden at all, you can still do your bit for wildlife in whatever space you have. Be creative and have fun every little action counts!
- Make Space for Nature Composting By making your own compost or buying peat-free commercial compost
  you will help conserve peatlands, a very rare habitat in Northern Ireland.
- Make Space for Nature Hedges for Wildlife Hedges are often called 'wildlife corridors' as they link up wild areas, providing a route by which both plants and animals move between habitats.
- Make Space for Nature Feeding the Birds by following these simple suggestions you will notice the amount
  and variety of birds in your garden increases dramatically, and you can help birds survive the winter and raise
  their nestlings each year.
