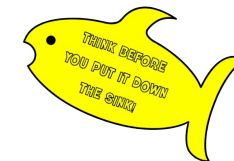
Protect local wildlife



The watercourses in Bromsgrove are failing the Environment Agency's standards for chemicals and wildlife. We have partnered with them to improve these and are looking forward to working with Bromsgrove's residents to help wildlife in the town.

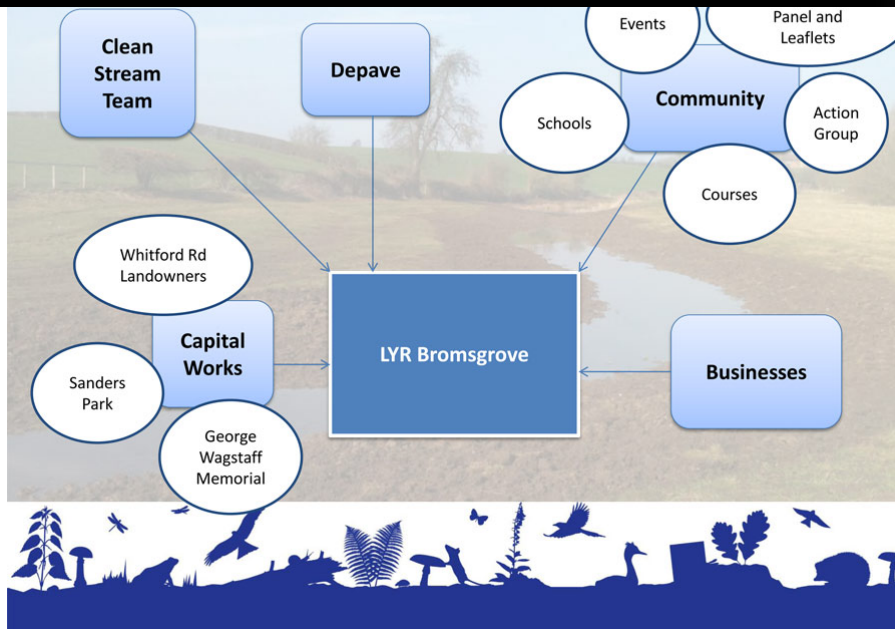
Keep an eye out for yellow fish popping up in your area soon...
