Indoor meetings - new venue

The inaugural meeting at the Group's new venue, [St Saviour's Church Hall](#) in Hagley, all went to plan even though the village was very much busier than usual due to the opening of a new 'hostelry'. Fittingly, it was also New Members Evening so WWT Trustee Roger Pannell gave a short talk about the work of the Trust to the audience. Even for people who have been members for some time, it was great to have an update about the recent and future conservation projects. This was followed by an excellent presentation by Mike Wilkes, whose photographs of wildlife were truly wonderful. This month's indoor meeting featured a photographic and video presentation by Rosemary Winnall MBE. Her talk 'Nature in Focus' highlighted some of the smaller or more unusual species of flora and fauna found in the British Isles, and once again, the images were inspirational!

The final meeting of 2017 will take place at St Saviour's Church Hall on Friday 24th November, starting at 7.30pm. Well-known local naturalist Gordon Forrest will be speaking about the '[Wildlife of Randan Meadows](#)'. These small but significant meadows are situated near to Dodford, to the southwest of the Worcestershire Wildlife Trust's Randan Wood nature reserve, and lie within the Feckenham Forest SSSI.
