We need to convince Welsh Government of the need for a new law – a Countryside Act - to improve protection for our country's wildlife. Assembly Members (AM) will be asked to pass a new law next year on the future of land management in Wales. Although we have some amazing environmental laws in Wales we are still losing wildlife. So we need a new focus on creating a country with more wildlife because it is better for me – and better for you too!

The campaign for a wilder future starts here....
Critically, we need a Countryside Act to give us a Nature Recovery Network.

Wildlife cannot survive for long in isolated pockets, and our wildlife sites are currently too small and disconnected from one another to prevent a disastrous decline in wildlife.

A Nature Recovery Network secured in law would map important places for wildlife, allowing us to create more space for nature and re-connect broken and isolated habitats together, providing vital links or 'wildlife corridors' for

species such as hedgehogs and otters to survive and thrive.

If Wales committed to mapping nature's recovery, alongside setting ambitious legal targets to increase the abundance of our wildlife, it would have a world-leading, which would help us all be more connected to nature, healthier and happier.

How would a Countryside Act help wildlife in Wales?
Improve people's access to nature, especially in towns and cities

- Improve air quality, especially in towns and cities
- Stop poisoning our rivers and streams with chemicals
- Reduce emissions that are contributing to climate change
- Protect people's rights to a healthy natural environment
