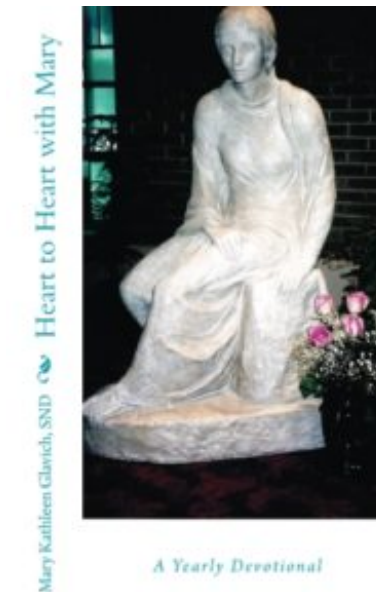

- Where is Jesus being crucified today?

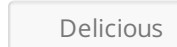
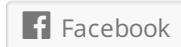
Chapter 24
