Some of the bags are old and dusty carrying years of piled up dirt, hurts and hard feelings that crusted up your heart.

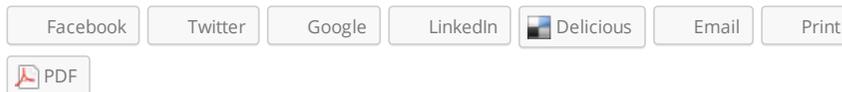
Why don't you start unpacking them now, before you take your final bow.
