Listen to Jesus' last plea from parched lips as he hung on the cross for our salvation.

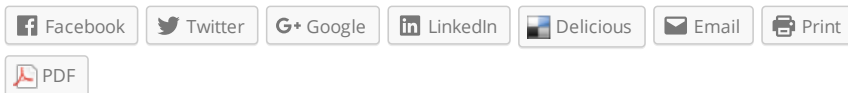
"I pray for not only them, but also for those who believe in me through their word, so that they may be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us..."
