We could also become a hypocritical, righteous individual.

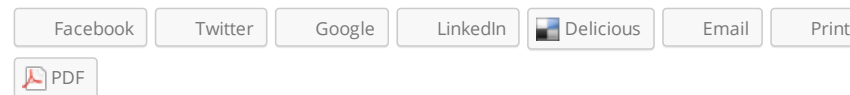
Like too much longing for natural desires,
