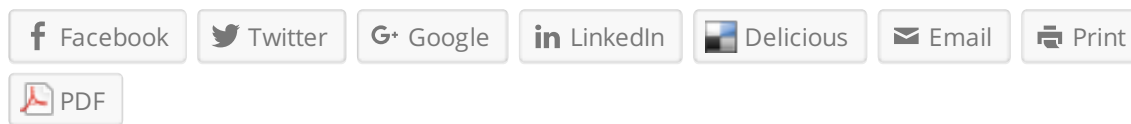
Modern Healers
