Rebirth me to new life—free

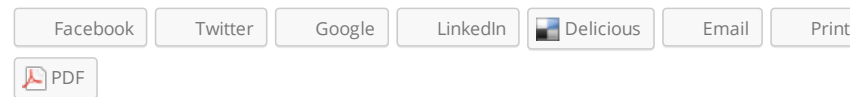
For new dying and new rebirth
